Committee Achievements

Rebuild of Club Website

It was decided to rebuild the club website on a platform that is easier to administer. The current website requires knowledge of coding which may not always be available within the club.

We are in the process of drawing up a draft design of the site, including text and graphics. It is my recommendation that the incoming committee continue with this work so that the club has a website that is easy to administer and continues to be a great online asset for our club.

Online Meetings

As we enjoyed our Christmas meeting in early December, I doubt any of us thought that within three months, our country would have changed dramatically due to the pandemic that is Coronavirus and we would need to move to online meetings.
