

Annual Business Meeting Tuesday 3 May 2022

President's Report

I have enjoyed my year as President of Spinnaker Toastmaster club.

The 2021/2022 year saw a return of the Covid pandemic, with a nationwide shutdown meaning our meetings moved online for a time. The shutdown was also just in time for our first club contest. This initially resulted in the club cancelling our contest, but with online contests being permitted, we were able to hold very successful contests.

As a result of the ongoing pandemic, almost all Spinnaker Toastmaster club meetings were held as hybrid meetings, where some club members joined via Zoom. This new capability provided a way for Spinnaker to continue to meet throughout the 2021/2022 year with no major impact.

Hybrid meetings are only possible because the St Andrews Parish allow us to use their wi-fi connection, and that Gary Nicholson provided a top-of-the-line web camera. There is a cost to the club - the Zoom subscription – details of which are included in the financial report.

There has been a decline in membership. We have 12 financial members as opposed to 16 in May 2021. This is of concern and reflects a drop in numbers across Toastmasters in general and globally. To put this in context, there are now approximately 45 Toastmasters across all of J1 clubs as opposed to over 100 Toastmasters a few years ago.

Maintaining and growing our membership was a challenge the committee took on in May 2021. Paul as VP Membership and Darrell as VP PR have done a fantastic job in managing enquiries from people interested in Spinnaker and welcoming them when they visited. However, mainly because of Covid restrictions, we have not signed up any new members.

Maintaining and growing our membership will be the principal challenge for the incoming committee.

Toastmasters Educational Programme

Toastmasters is primarily an educational organisation, with the aim of improving members' public speaking and leadership skills.
